

2015 was a good year for new products and gadgets designed to help make life on the road a little easier and a little safer. From multipurpose tools to electronics to truck parts/accessories, we saw some pretty cool stuff. Here are the Top 10 products — plus two bonus products thanks to a three-way tie for the 10th spot — that caught the attention of our readers.

The Trucker's Friend

Everyone needs a friend. That must be why The Trucker's Friend, featured in the February issue, was such a hit with readers. This multipurpose tool goes everywhere with you and is your first grab when it comes to hacking, prying or pulling. The tool has a curved axe, hammer and nail puller, spanner, pry bar and lever, tire chain hook, wire twist, and ice and debris remover — all in one convenient tool.



Dash cams are a valuable tool for truckers for a variety of reasons, especially in the unfortunate instance of an accident. The CDR 825E Drive HD Dash Cam from Cobra Electronics features a built-in G-Sensor that automatically captures and secures critical footage before, during and after an accident in 1080p full HD video. It also optimizes storage with continuous loop recording that deletes old video to make room for new. The popular CDR 825E appeared in the March/April issue.

Truck-Lite LED Headlight System

Winter means fewer daylight hours and more night driving. Readers of the December/January issue — aka the dead-of-winter issue — liked the new 4-inch-by-6-inch rectangular LED headlight system from Truck-Lite. Super Combo Tool


